Numerous Initiatives supporting Forest & Landscape Restoration

- * AFR100 (African Forest Landscape Restoration Initiative BMZ)
- * 20x20 (World Resources Institute)
- * Forest Restoration Mechanism FAO
- * Forest Ecosystem Restoration Initiative (FERI, South Korea)
- * Forest Restoration Hubs (IUCN)



- the process is important
- many countries have developed, published their national FLR action plans, strategies
- many countries use the IUCN/WRI ROAM Methodology
